



#1 - Te Deum - also known as Grand Sultan
Japonica - Dark Red / Dark Coral, Large (4-5") - semidouble to formal double -
curled back petals, huge buds, red anthers and yellow filaments. Registered in 1890
- Europe to US



#2 - Adolphe Audusson Variegated
Japonica - Deep Red/Marbled White, blooms mid-season, Large, Variegated, red
then white anthers standing straight with yellow filaments. Registered in US in
1941 as variegated form of Adolphe Audusson camellia

White - Medium, white anthers and yellow filaments with yellow center



#4 - Pink Perfection - also known as Frau Minna Siedel or Usu-Otome
Japanica - Light Pink - small - dense petals, slight inward curvature. Registered in
1875, Japan to US.



#5 - Glen 40 - also known as Coquetti
Japonica - Rosy/deep Red - medium, Rose Form Double. Registered 1942



#6 - Magnoliaeflora, also known as Hagoromo
Japonica - Blush Pink - medium - Semi-Double. Registered 1886, Japan to Italy



#7 - Mathotiana

Japonica - Deep Pink to Purple, Large, defined veins, high petal count, white anthers, yellow filaments. Blooms mid - late season, Rose form double to formal double. Registered in 1840, Europe to US, Magnolia Plantation.



#8 - ?

Japonica - white, semidouble with loose irregular lightly crinkled petals interspersed with stamens.



#9 - Lavina Maggi

Japonica - White with red streaks, formal double, with sports of solid red or white. Registered in 1858 - Italy.



#10 - Anita

Japonica - Light pink striped carmine with red streaks and flecks, semidouble, white anthers with yellow filaments. Large mid-season bloom. Olive green leaves. Registered in 1940 in California by Armstrong Nurseries. Oldest tree in the garden.



#11 - Professor Charles S Sargent
Japanica - Dark Red - Full peony to anemone form, medium size. Registered in 1908 in US



#12 - Geisha Girl
Japanica - Semidouble bloom - light pink with red flecks and streaks, golden anthers with yellow filaments. Registered in 1958 in California.



#13 - ?

Japonica - Semidouble medium pink with some veining and white dusting near center. Golden anthers with yellow filaments.



#14 - ?

Japonica - Formal Double, medium pink with very dense layers of petals curving back, some white streaks. Outer petals darker pink



#15 - ? Pearl Maxwell

Japanica - Formal double, light pink with dense layers of petals and darker center.



#16 - Mrs Lyman Clarke

Japanica - Semidouble to peony form - shaded orchid pink with white washed throughout. Registered in 1946 in Virginia Beach, Va



#17 - Governor Mouton

Variegated Red and White large bloom with yellow stamens and white filaments.
Large olive green very wide leaves.



#18 - ??

Bright pink with white variegation at outer edges. Peony form. Leaves dark green
and long with serration. Yellow stamens and white filaments.





#19 - Glenn Allan

Pink Formal double, opening in the shape of a bell into the formal double form. Long slender leaves. Open growth. Originated in from Walter Allan nurseries in Sommerville, SC near Magnolia Plantation.



#20 - Kumasaka - Medium sized bloom of deep rose-pink varying from rose-form double to peony-form with petals of varying size and shape. One of the oldest camellias in continuous culture.
